RE: Call for Papers: a special volume of *Research in Political Sociology* on Systemic Inequality, Sustainability and COVID 19

The global spread of Covid-19 has had devastating effects on developed and developing countries worldwide in terms of population's health, economy, politics, and countries' sustainability. It shattered personal lives, families, businesses, countries' health systems, education, global and national economies, and sustainable development. However, the effects are the most visible among disadvantaged populations as the pandemic amplified the already profound social inequalities and problems of environmental justice. Thus, it is critical to determine the scope, magnitude, and scale of pandemic effects on the most vulnerable groups. This special volume of *Research in Political Sociology* addresses the impact of COVID 19 on countries' development, exploring the consequences and interactions of COVID19 with social inequalities and sustainable development. We are inviting submission of papers to 29th volume to be published in 2022 entitled *Systemic Inequality, Sustainability and COVID 19*. The submission deadline is April 25, 2021.
